Facing Sadness Nehemiah 8:7-10

We must make a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.

Most of us falter at the prospect of making an honest personal inventory. Rationalizations and excuses for avoiding this abound. The bottom line is that we know there is an enormous amount of sadness awaiting us, and we fear the pain that facing the sadness will bring.

The Jewish exiles who returned to Jerusalem after captivity in Babylon had lost touch with God. During the Exile, they hadn't been taught his laws, so naturally, they hadn't practiced them either. After rebuilding the city wall and the Temple, the priests gathered the people together to read the Book of the Law. The people were overwhelmed with grief and began weeping, because their lives in no way measured up.

The priests said to the people, "Don't mourn or weep on such a day as this! For today is a sacred day before the LORD your God. . . . Go and celebrate with a feast of rich foods and sweet drinks, and share gifts of food with people who have nothing prepared. . . . Don't be dejected and sad, for the joy of the LORD is your strength!" (Nehemiah 8:9-10). The next day marked the beginning of the Festival of Shelters, a required Jewish feast celebrating the Israelites' escape from bondage in Egypt and God's care for them while they wandered in the wilderness.

When we set out to face the pain and sadness of making a moral inventory, we will need the "joy of the LORD" to give us strength. This joy comes from recognizing, even celebrating, God's ability to bring us out of bondage and care for us as we pass through the sadness toward a new way of life.

Learning the Word Nehemiah 8:7-8

Not only did Ezra publicly read the Scriptures; he also chose a team that was responsible for the public teaching of the Word. This group of men assisted the people in understanding what the Bible meant and how to apply it to their lives. Success in life always involves the study of Scripture and its application to our lives. The Bible tells us that we "have no excuse for not knowing God" (Romans 1:19-20) - even not having the Scriptures is no excuse. Without Scripture, however, it would be difficult to discern God's purpose in our life. Those of us who do have God' Word are responsible to live according to God's will and to help others understand what God expects of them.

The Importance of Boundaries

Nehemiah's rebuilding of the wall of Jerusalem illustrates the importance of personal boundaries in our lives. When we don't have boundaries, other people may feel as if they control us, and they usually can. Our identity becomes confused with the identities of others till we lose touch with who we really are. The Jews living in Jerusalem after the return from Babylon lacked physical boundaries of protection. They were at the mercy of the people living nearby. The task of rebuilding Jerusalem's boundaries met with opposition, for with a wall, the people of Jerusalem would be able to defend themselves against their enemies. Rebuilding the wall was a difficult task for Nehemiah, as it is for us, but we must have protective boundaries.
