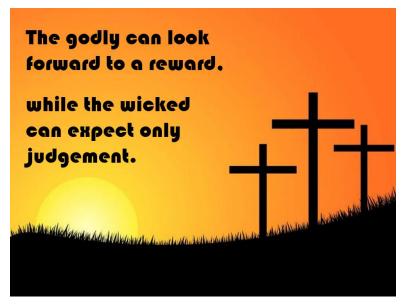

### **True Recovery Leads to Wise Conduct**

#### **Ephesians**

It is easy to think of recovery only in terms of stopping destructive behavior patterns. But it is important to see that the best way to stop destructive habits is to build constructive ones to replace them. We are able to lay aside old patterns when we consciously repent, turn our lives over to God, and seek his will for us each day. As we begin to obey God's will for our lives, we will no longer be following the path toward destruction.

## **Adoption into God's Family**

#### **Ephesians**

Many of us have painful memories from the past, particularly from the experiences we had in our families. Some of us have no positive memories of family life at all. The letter to the Ephesians reminds us that when we trust God as our Savior, he adopts us into a new family. In this family, God is our perfect and loving father. Even God's family, the Church, has its limitations and imperfections. But our Father is perfect, and becoming a part of his family is an all-important step in our spiritual walk.



### Acceptance thru Faith

# Ephesians 3:1-13

In these verses one truth stands out: God accepts all of us through faith. Race, reputation, and position have no bearing on God's forgiveness. Paul wrote these words to convince the believers of their oneness in Christ. Apparently some of the Jewish believers claimed superiority because of their relationship to God in the Old Testament Scriptures. Paul refuted their view by reminding them that our relationship with God is based on our trust in Jesus Christ, not our personal history or position in society. This important truth is encouraging for us in recovery. Our sins may have destroyed the reputation we once commanded. None of this matters to God. If we seek his forgiveness, he will accept us and help us make a new start.

God's Path Ephesians 4:1-6

Even though God's path for us is centered on his sovereign purposes and power, we have important responsibilities as well. What we believe about God is crucial, but so is the manner in which we live. For many of us, the recovery process is hindered by our faults, especially the stubborn pride that prevents us from confessing our sins. Recovery is impossible until we humbly admit that we are powerless and need God's help. As we trust God to help us, his Holy Spirit will replace our character flaws with humility, love, and patience. When God asks us to live a certain way, he provides the power we need to succeed.



#### Dealing with Anger Ephesians 4:26-27

Many of us have a hard time dealing with anger. Some of us have a history of rage, so we try to stifle our feelings. Others of us stuff down the feelings of anger, pretending they don't exist, because we were never allowed to express them in the past. If not knowing how to express anger properly is a serious problem for us, we may avoid trying to deal with it altogether. We may try to "put it off" and hope it goes away. Evaluating how to deal with anger appropriately is an important part of our Christian growth.



The apostle Paul said, "Don't sin by let- ting anger control you.' Don't let the sun go down while you are still angry, for anger gives a foothold to the devil" (Ephesians 4:26-27). One key is to have daily time limits for handling our anger-time to find ways to express the feelings and then let them go.

Dealing with anger promptly is important because when it is left to fester, it becomes bitterness. Bitterness is anger that has been buried and given time to grow. The Bible warns us: "Get rid of all bitterness, rage, anger, harsh words, and slander, as well as all types of evil behavior. Instead, be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you" (Ephesians 4:31-32).

We should never allow ourselves to become too hungry, angry, lonely, or tired. These are times when our self-control can slip and we fail to deal with our anger when it occurs.
